The meeting continued with the State Chairpersons reporting on their committee activities.

Announcements of interest were given during the reports as follows.

- 1. By laws review and changes were finally approved by the GL Judiciary and the NSEA.
- 2. 2023 Grand Lodge Convention will meet in Minneapolis July 2-5, and Nevada will be lodged at the Marriot Hotel. All those attending must register by May 20th.
- 3. The PER Association President announced that there is \$8,000.00 available for the nursing scholarship this year. The winners from the ticket sales were 1st place, Pat Lord, 2nd place, Kevin Faucett, and 3rd place, Eric Hoss.
- 4. Jack Eslinger announced that a check for \$2,000.00 was presented to Tim Mullen for the USO at the Las Vegas airport.
- 5. The Nevada State Elks Trustees met and presented the budget for the 2023-2024 year. A motion was made by John Whiteside and seconded by Ben Reed to accept the budget, was approved by the members, at the Saturday business meeting. There was discussion on the disposition of the Charity fund and consideration of the distribution of those funds.
- 6. Ben Reed read his resignation letter as two-year Trustee.

Announcements: NSEA Secretary announced that the 2023 Mid-Term meeting would be convened on November 16-19,2023 in Carson City. The Advisory Council reviewed the presentation to use the Carson City Plaza as the location for Mid-Term. The Advisory Council approved the presentation and gave the Convention Committee the ok to proceed. The Convention committee will be providing detailed information to the NSEA lodges later.

The ER march, raffle prizes, silent auction and donations resulted in a combined total of \$54,643.60 for our State Major Project.

NSEA Annual Trustee's Report April 28, 2023

The mission of the NSEA Trustees is to maintain financial stability of the NSEA monies to fund Grand Lodge and NSEA programs and charities. We do this by creating a workable budget which is approved by the membership.

The 2022/23 budget was approved 2022 for \$53,430. The 2022/23 Augmented Budget was amended and approved by the Interim Governing Board April 19, 2023. This Augmented Budget was \$90,970 due to the additional line items for the NSEA Conventions and Midterm Meetings. As of April 18, 2023, NSEA expenditures were \$48,647.94.

This year the NSEA Trustees began to compile a document titled, *Investment Account Guidelines*. NSEA By-Laws provide for an Investment Account under the direction of the Trustees. In 2014, the Board of Trustees appointed an Investment Committee to provide stewardship of this Account. Recently, the Trustees realized the need for guidelines for the account including its purpose and under what circumstances the funds be used. Most of this draft document has been completed, however several small steps remain. The Trustees will provide the members with additional updates.

The Trustees would like to recommend that the proposed 2023/2024 Budget be passed at the Business Meeting tomorrow.

The Trustees hours were 14,798 and milage was 632.

The Past Exalted Ruler Association respectfully submits the following report on NSEA PER activities during the 2022-2023 Lodge year:

On Friday, April 28, 2023 an NSEA PER Association Meeting was held as part of the April Convention. The meeting was well attended.

Sabina Bye gave the Treasurer's Report and stated that nothing had changed since the last report in November. Several members and lodges paid their dues at the meeting and many lodges turned in their tickets and sales for the Nurses Scholarship as well. \$8,000 is available from NSEA for Scholarships in addition to ticket sales and Sabina encouraged the money to be spent.
